Housing Resources

Loan services and landlords are encouraged to work with mortgage holders and renters affected by the COVID-19 emergency to find the best options.

Rent & Mortgage Resources

State of Hawai'i Rent Relief and Housing Assistance Program

Eligible renters whose income has reduced because of COVID-19 and are at risk of eviction can receive up to \$1,500 per month in assistance. Apply online or call <u>Catholic Charities Hawai'i</u> at (808) 521-4357 or Aloha United Way at 2-1-1.

<u>Family Life Center Maui</u> is offering financial housing assistance. Assistance is limited to availability. Call (808) 877-0880 to check eligibility.

KHAKO Rental Assistance Program provides direct rental assistance payments, with counseling and case management for a minimum of 6 months to a year, to Maui residents at risk of becoming homeless due to a temporary lack of financial resources, and individuals/families moving from emergency shelter or transitional housing programs to permanent housing. Homeowners: Government-guaranteed mortgages such as FHA, USDA, VA, HUD Sec 184, <u>Fannie Mae</u>, or <u>Freddie Mac</u>, are eligible for interest and penalty-free forbearance (payments can be paused) for at least 6 months and up to one year with no penalty.

Helpful Tips

During the COVID-19 crisis, evictions for failure to pay rents, leases, or other related charges, and increasing of rent are prohibited until December 31, 2020.

Landlords cannot change the locks or otherwise lock you out of your rental unit without a court order, even if you have not paid your rent. <u>Fill out</u> this form if you have been illegally locked out.

Utilities & Support

Service providers are willing to waive late fees and maintain service for those affected by the pandemic. Contact each one directly to find out your options.

The Maui Department of Water Supply is waiving bill credit card convenience, transaction, and e-check fees until December 31. They will also not be shutting off any water service. Call (808) 270-7730 to set up a payment plan.

<u>Relief Grants</u>: May provide qualifying small businesses and nonprofits experiencing pandemic hardships grants to cover up to 100% of energy efficiency project costs. <u>Check for eligibility and apply here.</u>

Mental Health Tips

It is common to feel stressed or anxious during this time, but even when you don't have full control of a situation, there are things you can do:

- Choose one or two trusted sources for COVID-19 and check them only once or twice a day
- Follow healthy daily routines as much as possible. Even simple actions such as making your bed, keeping a schedule, and making time for breaks can make a difference.
- Take care of yourself through exercise and movement.
- Maintain your social networks and stay connected.
- Do meaningful things with your free time. Read a book, learn a new skill, take an online course, volunteer, do tasks around your home, etc.

COVID-19 Testing

If you believe you have been exposed to COVID-19 or develop any symptoms, contact your primary care provider (PCP). Only a doctor can decide if you need to be tested. Symptoms include cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, and new loss of taste or smell.
